On display about 700 objects, representing the most important testimonies of this extraordinary civilization, from its origins to the highlight and its apogee with the roman conquest. At the end of the exhibition's itinerary the visitor will encounter the bronze of the haranguer.

The aim of the exhibition is to show the power of the Etruscans through its objects, trying to explain how in just a few generations, this civilization passed from a tribal society based on lineage to a society organized into nuclear families. A sort of survey covering about 200 years starting from the 8th Century B.C.: from the formative period to the apogee of the ruling class.

The etruscan power is documented with reference to its aristocratic function that progressively turns into an oligarchy. The wealth of the ruling class, the role of women and the ideological foundation are illustrated through the cult of the ancestors, the continuity of aristocracy, the celebration of feasts, the rule and function of religion concerning its social organization.
